

100th Anniversary Unit Coordinator

The 100th Anniversary Unit Coordinator must be a registered youth who is approved by their unit leader (Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Coach, Venture Crew Leader or Unit Committee Chair) and who agrees to the following:

1. Promote the 100th Anniversary of Scouting at a unit meeting with Scouts, leaders and parents including promotion of the “Hall of Leadership”
2. Encourage all leaders and parents to visit and sign up at the www.BSAalumni.org website
3. Hold a “Generations Connection” event by planting a tree or holding a service project on or around Arbor Day 2010 (can use trees from the Arbor Day Foundation)
4. Have 30% or more of the registered Scouts in your unit earn one or more of the Year of Celebration patches.

National Hall of Leadership

This is a one-time opportunity during the 100th Anniversary to honor and recognize Scouts, leaders and any living person who has served as a Scouting volunteer for the extraordinary difference they have made in the lives of others through their leadership. Nominations will be in the form of stories submitted online for judging.

To be nominated for the National Hall of Leadership, the nominee must be a living Scout or Scouting volunteer who may/may not be officially registered with the BSA.

They also must have served as an active Scout or Scouting volunteer within Scouting for at least one year. A nominee may be young or old — there is no age limit for nominees.

Generations Connection

Nearly every youth who experiences Scouting does so with members of their family.

The degrees of family involvement may vary, but ultimately Scouting provides an opportunity to strengthen ties between family members, create great family memories and develop a shared family foundation of worthwhile virtues and values.

Our Generations Connection celebration will focus around Arbor Day with an opportunity to plant trees as a symbol of Scouting’s impact across generations.
